Ordination Prayer

<u>Disciples Home Missions</u> put together a sample service which includes prayer order and service guidelines. According to DHM, here's how the service would begin:

Call to Worship

Leader: Come, let us worship God. There are different gifts,

People: but it is the same Spirit who gives them.> Leader: There are different ways of serving God, People: but it is the same God who is served. Leader: Each one is given a gift by the same Spirit,

People: to use for the common good.

Leader: Together we are the Body of Christ,

People: and individually members with one another.

Opening Prayer

Leader:

Holy God, you give the church varied gifts and ministries and call forth men and women to receive and fulfill them. Open us to the power of your Holy Spirit as we gather to offer you our thankful praise. Be present with us, we pray, as we ordain our sister/brother to your service. All these things we ask in the name of our Savior Jesus Christ. Amen

After delivering information about the service, singing hymns and delivering the sermon, the ordination ceremony begins in earnest the presentation of the candidates and their responses. Then comes the Affirmation of Faith:

Regional Minister:

Together, let us renew our covenant with Christ.

People:

We confess that Jesus is the Christ, the Son of the Living God, and proclaim him Lord and Savior of the world. In Christ's name and by his grace, we accept our mission of witness and service to all people. We rejoice in God, Maker of heaven and earth, and in the covenant of love which binds us to God and one another. Through baptism into Christ we enter into newness of life and are made one with the whole people of God. In the communion of the Holy Spirit we are joined together in discipleship and in obedience to Christ. At the table of the Lord we celebrate with thanksgiving the saving acts and presence of Christ. Within the universal Church we receive the gift of ministry and the light of Scripture. In the bonds of Christian faith we yield ourselves to God, that we may serve the One whose Kingdom has no end. Blessing, glory and honor be to God forever. Amen.

Hymns and blessings often follow and many churches will mark the occasion with Holy Communion. This is a traditional prayer that would follow the breaking of bread, according to Disciples Home Missions:

O God, we thank you for uniting us by baptism in the body of Christ and by this meal filling us with joy and hope. Grant that in the days ahead our lips which have sung your praises may speak the truth, our eyes which have seen your love may look with compassion on the needs of the world; our hands which have held this loaf and this cup

may be servant hands for Jesus Christ; in whose name we ask it all. Amen.

The service usually concludes with a final blessing. This is a great ordination prayer for your reference. However, it is important to note that ordination is never the task of one person. Rather, when we come to lay hands upon the ordained, the presiding minister involves others in the praying. Sometimes it may be more appropriate to develop prayers of your own to suit the situation.
